THE POSITION**

The Board of Trustees of the West Contra Costa Unified School District invites strong, ethical leaders with a track record of success in improving the achievement of all students, engaging staff, parents, families, and students in meaningful decision-making processes, and working in diverse and more complex communities to apply for the position of District superintendent. WCCUSD's new superintendent will use a clear and focused equity lens to identify and evaluate strategies and initiatives that will provide the academic and social emotional support WCCUSD's diverse student populations require so that they all graduate prepared for success in higher education and/or a career with growth potential. In addition, the new superintendent will work collaboratively with labor and community partners to identify and implement teaching and learning practices that will build positive student-teacher relationships, establish high expectations for each student, and engage students in meaningful and relevant learning experiences. This position provides a unique and challenging leadership opportunity for a courageous leader who has a true passion for the work of public education to help unite WCCUSD's diverse students, staff, parent, and community voices in achieving a common vision and mission. Strong fiscal and facilities management skills are also essential. The next leader will be driven by the core values of integrity, transparency, humility, and teamwork to keep students at the front and center of the District's work and provide the high-quality education each and every child in West Contra Costa Unified deserves.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Board of Education has retained Consultants Jim Brown, Sandy Thorstenson, Eric Andrew, and Juan Garza of Leadership Associates to partner with the Board in the superintendent selection process. The consultants conduct a stakeholder engagement process, recruit candidates, screen applications and recommend candidates to the Board for interviews and further consideration. The Board will have the opportunity to review all applications submitted. Any contact with board members, in an attempt to influence the selection process, will be considered a breach of professional ethics. Finalists will have an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the community and schools. Board members reserve the right to visit the District and communities of a candidate prior to a final decision.

SALARY AND CONTRACT

The salary will be competitive and based upon qualifications and experience. A multi-year contract will be considered.

THE DISTRICT

West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) is located in one of the most diverse areas of California with 28,121 students enrolled in the 2018-19 school year. The district serves a diverse student population where the majority of students (53%) are Hispanic/Latinx, followed by African American (14%), Asian (11%), White (11%), Filipino (5%), Two or More Races (5%), and Pacific Islander (.5%).

There are 55 schools and 3,489 full and part-time staff. The District offers six comprehensive high schools, six middle schools, two alternative education high schools, one alternative education elementary school, 32 elementary schools, several dual-immersion elementary schools, and five K-8 schools.

Seventy-four percent of WCCUSD students are low income and/or English learners. Most students (64%) are classified as low income, which means they receive free or reduced-price lunch. Nearly one in three students (30%) are English Learners (EL), exceeding the state's rate of 21%. The district also served 115 foster youth and 802 homeless youth.

In July 2016, the District developed Roadmap 2.0. This new vision is transforming the district into a learner-centered organization where: Students are constantly acquiring the skills and knowledge to succeed in the 21st century. Staff is talented and empowered. Families continue to choose our schools year after year. The ambitious plan outlined in Roadmap 2.0 includes three goals: Achieving Students, Thriving Employees, and Caring Schools.

As a Full-Service Community Schools district, WCCUSD works with its community partners to provide the resources necessary to achieve educational success, well-being, and self-efficacy for

students, families, and communities. WCCUSD's diverse community traditionally values and supports its schools.

Students in the District have access to a robust Visual and Performing Arts curriculum, several after school programs and services, innovative engineering and technology pathways, and a comprehensive athletics program at each high school.

Challenges facing the District include addressing the historic inequities and access to opportunities in the community and harnessing the District's diversity and increasing equity and inclusion. Additionally, improving student success and academic outcomes of all students with a particular focus on students of color and those in poverty, dealing with the growth of charter schools, and ensuring that our resources are spent equitably and wisely are also challenges.

WCCUSD was established in 1965. It covers the cities of Richmond El Cerrito, San Pablo, Pinole, and Hercules and the unincorporated areas of Bayview-Montalvin Manor, East Richmond Heights, El Sobrante, Kensington, North Richmond, and Tara Hills. For more information, visit: <u>www.wccusd.net</u>.

THE COMMUNITY

West Contra Costa County sits on San Francisco and San Pablo bays, northwest of the City of San Francisco, and is home to an estimated 261,000 residents of diverse backgrounds.

The unemployment rate is 10.6 percent for the entire West County area and the median household income is \$63,137. 16.8 percent of families with children under 18 are living in poverty.

Single mothers lead about 25 percent of households with children under 18. 35 percent of those families live in poverty.

Home to many of the workers who drive the Bay Area's tech economy, the area features Chevron's Richmond refinery and Hercules-based Bio-Rad Laboratories, Inc.

There are many densely populated areas in the southern and western portions of the District, while the northern and eastern ends feature more rural areas with rolling hillsides and hidden valleys. Spanning more than 61 square miles, much of the landscape is reserved for open spaces, including large portions of Wildcat Canyon Regional Park and Point Pinole Regional Shoreline.

The area featured large rancheros before California became a state, and many large swathes of land are still reserved for cattle grazing and undeveloped woodland in the areas surrounding Pinole, Hercules, and the unincorporated community of El Sobrante.

From the hills in San Pablo, Richmond, and El Cerrito, visitors can see the Golden Gate Bridge, Bay Bridge, the San Francisco skyline, and Mount Tamalpais. Those who enjoy the outdoors have hundreds of miles of hiking trails, including the Bay Area Ridge Trail and San Francisco Bay Trail, and fishing in both the San Pablo Bay and freshwater reservoirs and lakes.

The area also includes multiple opportunities to participate in the arts, visit museums, and enjoy the many entertainment options available within the greater Bay Area.
