- Has experience in establishing effective systems and structures around equity, diversity, and
 inclusion to improve the educational experiences of all students and staff
- Has a strong instructional background with a background of increasing secondary student academic achievement
- Has a background and experience of working collaboratively with labor unions
- Has a track record of uniting staff, families and community around a shared vision, mission, core values and goals
- Has experience and understands the importance of establishing business partnerships for the benefit of the students served
- Is a decisive educational leader who has experience effectively collaborating with community leaders and other stakeholders by clearly communicating district objectives and goals

SELECTION PROCESS

The Board of Education has retained Consultants Drs. Fred Van Leuven and David Verdugo of Leadership Associates to recruit qualified candidates. The consultants will screen applications and recommend candidates to the Board for interviews and further consideration. The Board will have the opportunity to review all applications submitted. Any contact with board members, in an attempt to influence the selection process, will be considered a breach of professional ethics. Finalists will have an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the community and schools. Board members reserve the right to visit the District and communities of a candidate prior to a final decision.

The salary will be competitive and based upon qualifications and experience. A multi-year contract will be considered.

The Antelope Valley Union High School District (AVUHSD) District Office is in the City of Lancaster, California, (Los Angeles County). It includes eight traditional and three alternative high schools, SOAR - an early college high school on the Antelope Valley College campus, the no-cost, charter Academy Prep Junior High, an online education program and Antelope Valley Adult Education. The district serves 23,000 students in the cities of Palmdale and Lancaster, and the surrounding area.

Our schools offer a variety of programs to prepare students for college and careers. Our career academies and pathways, which focus students' coursework toward a specific field of interest, include industries such as agriculture, digital design, engineering, environmental science, health care, law and government, the arts and multimedia.

THE ANTELOPE VALLEY

The Antelope Valley, which includes the cities of Palmdale and Lancaster, is located approximately one hour north of Los Angeles and a short drive to beaches including Malibu and Santa Monica, Disneyland Resort, Hollywood, Six Flags California, ski resorts and more.

Set among the beautiful Southern California high desert, the Valley's total population exceeds 542,000.

Home to California's annual Poppy Festival and the Los Angeles County Airshow, which attract thousands of visitors, the area features a diverse assortment of home options ranging from executive custom homes to affordable family homes.

The Valley's economic engine is driven by many industries including aerospace, healthcare, manufacturing, agriculture, and film. Major aerospace employers include NASA, Lockheed Martin, Boeing, Northrop Grumman, and Edwards Air Force Base.

Two main hospitals, Antelope Valley Hospital and Palmdale Regional Medical Center, provide myriad health care services for the region. In addition to elementary and high school education, the Valley provides various higher education options including a local community college - Antelope Valley College, California State University extension campuses and private universities that allow community members to continue their education locally.

Residents can enjoy a wide variety of retail shopping opportunities at the Antelope Valley Mall and assorted mini-malls, along with "big-box" stores. Local and franchise eateries are abundant, providing everything from steak houses to wine bars and tea rooms.

Many cultural and recreational amenities provide residents with choices for leisure activities. The area features dozens of parks and Palmdale's Dry Town Water Park. Each summer, the annual Antelope Valley Fair & Alfalfa Festival showcases concerts, livestock exhibits, food and fun. Performing arts theaters and a local amphitheater attract headline talent, and movie theaters offer the latest releases.

The arts are celebrated in local museums and art galleries including the Lancaster Museum of Art and History, which offers traveling exhibits.
