The new superintendent will identify, implement, and support initiatives that enhance the District's outstanding accomplishments in academics, foster a climate of care, and promote a focus on the whole child. The new superintendent will lead a high-performing team dedicated to continuous improvement of District performance in all arenas.

The Oak Park Unified School District seeks a superintendent who:

- Has previous leadership experience in a district with similar demographics
- Experience as a teacher, principal, and significant experience as a central office administrator

SELECTION PROCESS

The Board of Education has retained consultants William Banning and Sandra Sánchez-Thorstenson of Leadership Associates to recruit qualified candidates. The consultants will screen applications and recommend candidates to the Board for interviews and further consideration. The Board will have the opportunity to review all applications submitted. Any contact with board members, in an attempt to influence the selection process, will be considered a breach of professional ethics. Finalists will have an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the community and schools. Board members reserve the right to visit the District and communities of a candidate before a final decision.

SALARY AND CONTRACT

The salary will be competitive and based on qualifications and experience. The approximate salary range is \$250,000 - \$290,000.

To be considered, the candidate must provide:

- Three current letters of recommendation (within the past twelve months)

Oak Park Unified School District (OPUSD) is a high-performing, comprehensive public PK-12 school district located in the community of Oak Park in south Ventura County. The District was formed in 1977 when residents voted to create a new school district to better meet the needs of its residents, beginning a long tradition of placing the highest priority toward ensuring a high-quality education.

OPUSD serves approximately 4,400 students and comprises a preschool, three elementary schools, a middle school, a high school, an independent study school, and an alternative high school for students with unique learning needs. Students from the entire region are drawn to attend Oak Park schools with about 53% percent of students coming from neighboring districts via the State's District of Choice program (38%) and through inter-district transfers and permits (15%) including many children of our staff members.

OPUSD excels in educational achievements, boasting the highest CAASPP scores in Ventura County and ranking in the top 15 in California. All OPUSD schools have been honored as California Gold Ribbon/CA Distinguished schools. Oak Park High School, with a 99.7% graduation rate in 2022-23, was named a 2021 National Blue Ribbon School, recognized nationally for closing the achievement gap. Our students excel in AP courses, evidenced by an 89% pass rate. This academic excellence leads to acceptances at top colleges and universities, with over 96% of our graduates pursuing higher education. The statistics published by Niche underscore our standing: #1 in Ventura County, #11 in the Los Angeles Area, and #15 Best Unified District in California.

Oak Park High School, serving approximately 1,450 students in grades 9-12 is nationally recognized for its academic excellence. OPHS is a National Blue Ribbon School and was named a California Distinguished School in 2019 and a Gold Ribbon School in 2015.

OPUSD's rigorous curriculum, high standards and supportive community of educational partners ensure students develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills, exceeding expectations in both standardized and college entrance exams. Our focus on quality education prepares students for success in their future academic and professional endeavors.

The District has also been recognized as a Green Ribbon school district by the CA Department of Education and the US Department of Education for its focus on environmentally progressive policies and practices. In May 2019, the District received the Exemplary School District Award from the CA Department of Education for the second consecutive year. OPUSD was also named the 2018 "Best Green School System" by the US Green Building Council and the Council for Green Schools.
